

IMPORTANT INFO

I know most of you that did a change of address with the post office put a STOP date on it, but just to make sure that it gets stopped from being forwarded, wait until you return home and contact your *local* Post Office and tell them you're back and to STOP forwarding your mail. Let them make the change. This should stop having the mail shipped back and forth, getting caught in a loop. This is for US Mail. I will start to forward your mail when you let the office know that you are leaving. It would also be a plus to drop a slip or note in the IN PARK BOX located on the back side of the mailroom, for me in case I haven't been informed.

It is very important for those who have medicine shipped here to stress when ordering which address to ship it to. This will get it to you faster in case you are running low. If it has to be forwarded from here it could be delayed. And there have been issues where the post office returns to sender for reasons unknown.

Also PLEASE contact your newspaper and magazine subscribers and change your address directly because by law we are only responsible for forwarding those items for 2 months.

We know many of you asked to have your Lot # added to your forwarded mail and it was left off. When returning in the fall PLEASE stress to your local Post Office that it is necessary to have it included in your address. Please also let any of your correspondence like family know that it needs to be on the envelope.

The mail room is very challenging and in order to make sure that everyone gets their mail, these things need to be addressed. Any questions PLEASE ask me and together hopefully we'll make it a smooth transition.

Have a safe and healthy summer and I look forward to seeing you all in the fall. Remember to check out with the office and check in when returning.




